

# KICKSTART YOUR CONSERVATION

## Simple Ways to Save Water



### Keep It Tight

Fix leaky faucets, pipes and hoses. Even a small drip can waste several gallons per day.



### Load It Up

Full dishwasher and washing machine loads save anywhere from 5 to 45 gallons per cycle.



### Go Low-Flow

Install low-flow toilets and showerheads. Flushing alone can exceed 30 gallons per day.



### Use Your Shower Power

Keep showers under five minutes or switch to a low-flow showerhead.



### Turn Off the Tap

Turn off water while brushing your teeth or shaving.



### Don't Drain It

Capture water while waiting for the tap to heat up and reuse it for plants or cleaning.



### Choose Water-Wise Plants

Swap thirsty lawns for California-friendly and native plants.



### Let It Grow

Set mower blades to 2–3 inches. Taller grass shades soil and improves moisture retention.



### Get Smart About Irrigation

Use weather-based irrigation controllers to water only when needed.



### Put a Lid On It

Pool covers reduce evaporation and save thousands of gallons each year.

### **Rotating Sprinkler Nozzle**

Use rotating nozzles that allow soil to absorb water more efficiently.



### **Weather-Based Irrigation Controllers**

Automatically adjust watering schedules based on weather.



### **Rain Barrels and Cisterns**

Collect and reuse rainwater for watering lawns and gardens.



### **High-Efficiency Toilets**

Reduce indoor water use with efficient flushing systems.
