

LADWP Adopts LA County Water Plan

In August, the Los Angeles Department of Water and Power (LADWP) formally adopted the LA County Water Plan, joining seven other leading local water agencies in signifying its commitment to securing a safe, reliable water future for all of Los Angeles County.

As the largest municipal utility in the nation, LADWP's adoption of the plan marks an important step in realizing the plan's goals, which include increasing the region's water supply by 600,000-acre feet by 2045 through stormwater capture, recycled water, water conservation, and other strategies.

LA Water Project Highlight: Alondra Park Stormwater **Capture Project**

Located in the unincorporated community of El Camino Village, LA County's Alondra Park Multi-Benefit Stormwater Capture Project will revitalize the existing Alondra

The project, which broke ground earlier this year, includes construction of a new drainage system to capture and treat stormwater along with enhancements to the park, including new multipurpose turf fields and upgraded baseball fields. The Project also includes nature-based solutions with the planting of native and drought-tolerant vegetation and trees, bio-swales, and permeable pavements that mimic natural processes, which will improve stormwater quality by preventing stormwater pollutants from ultimately discharging into to the Dominguez Channel.
